"Industry 4.0 - Aligning Employee Relations"

Industry 4.0 is a name given to the current trend of automation and data exchange in manufacturing technologies. It includes cyber-physical systems, the Internet of things, cloud computing and cognitive computing. It is commonly referred to as the fourth **industrial revolution**.
